Fr. Kyle Tannehill

I was born and raised in Kalispell, MT. Following high school I attended MSU and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Music Education. The summer following graduation I worked as a camp counselor at our diocesan



summer camp, Legendary Lodge. It was there that I first learned how to pray. Though I was raised as a 'Cradle Catholic', I didn't know much about prayer apart from attending Mass and praying the rosary.

As I grew in relationship with Jesus, I began to have a sense that He was asking me to go to the seminary. I wasn't able to go to the seminary right away though because I had already accepted a music teaching job at a little Catholic school in my hometown. Part of my job description was to teach first grade religion. During that year of teaching, I realized that I was having an experience of fatherhood, not natural fatherhood, but spiritual fatherhood. After only one year of teaching, I decided, to enter the seminary.

I attended seminary at St. John Vianney Theological Seminary in Denver, CO for seven years. I had no idea if I was supposed to be a priest when I arrived, and it wasn't until my third year in seminary when I finally received the grace to choose to be a priest.

In short, seminary formation is about becoming a good father, which is exactly what a priest is supposed to be. A good father provides for the needs of his children and is both gentle and firm, always speaking the truth. Jesus says, "'Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart'" (Mt 11:29).

I moved to California at eighteen in pursuit of my childhood dream. The goal was to live a luxurious and adventurous life in the fashion industry: going to the beach, attending fashion shows and working for the most popular



After a year spent in LA, the Lord asked me to step out of the boat of my own desires in exchange for His grander plan saying, "You are made for more." I enrolled at Boise State where I was immediately welcomed by the community at St. Paul's Catholic Student Center.

It was through the pursuit of a FOCUS missionary and the Campus Minister at the time that I began to see what Jesus meant when He told me I was made for more. I finally grasped the reality that my life is not my own, I belong to Him. I am here to walk with poor souls and show them what it truly means to love and be loved by God.

Understanding this Truth dramatically changed the trajectory of my life. I was being asked to spend my time on earth serving the Lord in ministry. Shortly after graduation, I was hired as the Campus Minister at St. Paul's Catholic Student Center.

Three years later, the Lord once again has called me to step out of the boat and leave Boise. I can't help but acknowledge God's intentionality. I traded a career in the fashion industry for a life poured out for the Lord with love.

This new lite is more abundant than anything I could possibly imagine as the Lord is constantly surprising me. I am so excited to be a Bobcat! I hope to continue to be a vessel for the Lord.

Jesus is the perfect example to imitate if we want to be good Christians.

At the end of the Gospel of John, Jesus reveals Himself to His apostles while they are fishing:

Just as day was breaking, Jesus stood on the beach; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you any fish?" They answered him, "No." He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in, for the quantity of fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" (John 21:4-7)

Not only is Jesus the High Priest, but He is also a father. He is not God, the Father; He is God, the Son, but priests are supposed to imitate the fatherhood that Jesus expresses to His apostles.

We are supposed to be meek and humble of heart. We are supposed to take up our cross and follow Him. We are supposed to give of ourselves just as Jesus laid down His life for His friends.
